CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Ritter called the regularly scheduled work session of the Carroll Township Board of Supervisors to order at 6:31 p.m. The location of the meeting is the Carroll Township Municipal Building, 555 Chestnut Grove Road, Dillsburg, Pennsylvania.

CARROLL DRIVE
AND ROUTE 15
SOUTH
INTERSECTION

David Bush – 37 Carroll Drive – is concerned about the intersection of Carroll Drive and Route 15 South. He feels this intersection is outdated and needs to be updated. He stated that Representative Keefer told Mr. Bush that a state survey needs to be done and Carroll Township is who must start the process. The south bound side of Route 15 is limited access with over passes from Camp Hill to Carroll Drive. There is no flashing light, no speed reduction, etc., to warn motorists of a left turn lane or cross traffic ahead. The flashing light and the 50 MPH speed sign is south of the Carroll Drive intersection. Through traffic moves to the center lane, when signs indicating all trucks must move to the right lane, and they increase their speed well above 55 mph depending upon traffic conditions. This makes safe left turns almost impossible unless you speed up and go with the flow of the traffic. Many of these people are from out of state, going way over the speed limit and have no clue why you are in the left lane of a limited access interstate with your turn signal on. The north bound lane is just as bad with a 55 mph speed limit sign as soon as you get through the intersection of Ore Bank Road and Spring Lane Road with Route 15. A right turn onto Carroll Drive from Route 15 North is dangerous when you are in two lanes of traffic, ¼ of a mile long, with everyone speeding. The guy behind you moving to the left lane is surprising the person behind him with a vehicle doing 45 mph attempting to make a right turn onto Carroll drive. I really think the survey is overdue.

Supervisor Moyer-Schwille stated that she will take Mr. Bush's concerns to the next YAMPO meeting on July 31, 2018.

Chief Wargo had Records Officer Baptisti pull the traffic accident records for 2017 and 2018 for this intersection. In 2017 we had 5 accidents reported to the Police at or near that intersection. Only 1 of the 5 accidents happened in the left turn lane. The Police had no accidents reported for 2018.

COMMENT

Chairman Ritter called for public comment.

Brian Mackalonis – 132 Stonebridge Drive, is the President of the HOA for the Stonebridge Crossing Development. He is concerned about Lots 98 and 99 located in Stonebridge Crossing Phase I. He would like in writing from the Township what these lots are to be, paved, etc.? They also questioned if the Township can do anything to get the roads in Phase I dedicated and turned over to the Township. Can the Township call their bond to get the roads paved? They questioned what does it mean to have the roads dedicated to the Township? What is included after the dedication?

Chairman Ritter will talk to Brandon Slatt to get more information on these lots.

The following items were discussed and are to be placed on the June 11, 2018 Board of Supervisors Meeting Agenda for further discussion and take action:

1. Police Garage Door Openers Repair- Chief Wargo received three quotes to replace the garage door openers and remotes. They were Baker Door Company, Overhead Door, and Hershey Door Service, Inc.

Supervisor Schmick questioned the quotes that all the quotes didn't seem to be the same. The one stated remove and haul of existing units, includes interior 3 button wall stations and photo safety sensors.

Chief Wargo will check out the quotes to make sure they all include the same items.

2. Resolution 2018-09 – A Resolution authorizing an application to the Pennsylvania Municipal Assistance Program for the merger of Citizen's Fire Company of Dillsburg and Franklintown and Community Volunteer Fire Company forming the Northern York County Fire Rescue.

Rob Brady, Michael Whitzel, and Scott McClintock are here tonight to discuss the Pennsylvania Municipal Assistance Program. The Grant is for \$84,000.00 and it is a 50/50 grant. There is a three year window to spend the money and they need a municipality for the primary applicant. The other Municipalities will be supporting the Grant. The Fire Company has committed themselves, if need be, to fund the other 50% of the match. In the next couple of months the Fire Company wants to get with the Municipal Representatives to discuss the 2019 Budget and Municipal Agreements. At this point they are waiting for one piece of paper from the County of Orphans Court to finalize the merger.

Chairman Ritter questioned what percentage they are looking for from the Municipality.

1. Police Towing Procedure

Chief Wargo created and provided a copy of the Police Towing Procedure to the Board of Supervisors for their review. Chief Wargo stated that York County Control will manage the rotation. If new towers come into our area and meet our requirements, they will be added to the list.

Chairman Ritter questioned how the rotation will be managed and who will manage it. Chairman Ritter stated this is a standard policy and this is not something the Board would vote on.

2. Permission to advertise to sell the 1996 Dodge Pickup 2500 with plow – Tabled to the July 02, 2018 Work Session.

Supervisor Schmick questioned if we received the new one yet. If not, do we know when it is coming in? He stated a couple of months ago he asked the question if the Township was allow to donate equipment. He thinks there is a local organization that could make good use of this equipment. The Township could make a good choice and donate it.

Solicitor Stone cautioned the Township on doing this.
