MINOR PLAN FOR LOT #59 AND LOT #60 FOR CHESTNUT HOLLOW JEREMIAH STONGE It was moved by Supervisor Schmick, seconded by Supervisor Trostle, and unanimously carried to conditionally approve the Minor Subdivision Plan of Lot #59 and Lot #60 for Chestnut Hollow – Jeremiah Stonge contingent upon addressing all of the following comments in Phillip Brath's Comment Letter dated September 27, 2018 and that Dillsburg Borough Council approves the plan at their October 9, 2018 meeting:

UPDATE ON SPEND-A-BUCK DR. SIDEWALKS AND PAVING Phillip Brath gave a brief update on Spend-A-Buck Drive, Logan Downs side, as far as installing the sidewalks and paving the road. He stated that he got a call from Kinsey today and the contractor is to be on site Monday, October 15, 2018 to start the sidewalk installation, driveway restoration, base pavement installation for the tie in and then the wearing course installation, and finally the yard restoration. If it stays warm, they should be able to finish this year.

FINAL SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR MUSSER HOME BUILDERS SURETY RELEASE AND SET EIGHTEEN MONTH BOND It was moved by Supervisor Trostle, seconded by Supervisor Moyer-Schwille, and unanimously carried to release \$210,380.50 from the surety being held for improvements completed in the Final Land and Development Plan for Musser Home Builders, Inc. This will reduce the surety for this project from \$210,380.50 to zero dollars contingent upon establishing an eighteen (18) month irrevocable bond in the amount of \$19,436.25 for the public improvements and to cover the cost of purchasing, planting, maintaining and replacing all vegetative materials.

FINAL PLANS FOR RUTTER'S #14 PROPOSED EXPANSION It was moved by Supervisor Schmick, seconded by Supervisor Rocco, and unanimously carried to grant the following waiver requests for the Final Land Development Plan for Rutter's Store #14 Proposed Expansion as per Phillip Brath's Comment Letter dated September 28, 2018:

III. Waivers

- 1. Maximum foot candle limit to adjacent property shall not exceed 1 foot candle (708.f.B2)
- 2. The minimum intensity on site shall be 1 ½ foot candle measured to grade (708.f.B.3)
- 3. Wall pack lighting is not allowed on building walls that face roadways (708.f.B.5)
- 4. Intensity of illumination is limited to 5.0 foot candles at all areas of site (708.f.B.8)
- 5. Show all existing and proposed right-of-way with metes and bounds (501.c.4iii)

IV. General Recommendations

- 1. Concern that reconfiguring of pump island along common access drive to site will restrict free and unobstructed access when vehicles stack at pump islands or over standard length vehicles (vehicles with trailers) use facilities for refueling.
- 2. All fees must be paid prior to plan recording.
- 3. Waivers statement must be revised to reflect Board's action on each prior to recording.
