Did you know?

1. All recyclables (except leaf waste) can be mixed in the container provided by the Township.
2. Penn Waste will accept any size of cardboard if it is flattened and loose pieces bundled.
3. If the weather forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, if possible, keep your paper recyclables until next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.
4. There is no limit on recycling.
5. Recycling is mandatory in Carroll Township.

In January 2018, China implemented dramatic changes to the levels of contamination allowed in imported bales of recycled material. This changed the levels of contamination allowed per bale of imported recycled material from 5% to .05%. Contamination is any non-recyclable material that may get mixed in with a bale of recycled material. Some examples include plastic bags, medical waste and diapers. All of these materials should be tossed in your trash bin. Many customers are wishfully recycling materials that are not recyclable, leading to higher contamination rates. What can residents do to help out? We have been advising customers to think: "when in doubt, throw it out."

Leaf Waste Drop-Off

The Leaf Waste Facility is open. Stop in the Township Office to apply for your key card.

This drop-off facility, located along Sunny Lane to the rear of the Township building and maintenance shed, is available to Carroll Township residents and businesses. It is enclosed with fencing and gate access is controlled by a keycard system. Keycards are issued, at no cost to Carroll Township residents. Businesses located in Carroll Township will be charged \$300 per year and landscape/lawn service businesses located in Carroll Township will be charged \$500 per year for a keycard. Lost or damaged cards can be replaced for a \$20 fee. The facility is open: April 1 through September 30, Monday – Saturday from 7:00am to 8:00pm and October 1 through March 31, Monday – Saturday from 7:00am to 5:00pm. Closed Sunday. Materials accepted will be leaves, shrubbery, garden residue, tree trimmings, and similar materials. **NO** grass clippings, stumps, or root balls. Individuals are responsible for unloading items in designated areas. The collected materials are transported to a PA DEP permitted composting site. This Facility was funded by a Department of Environmental Protection Act 101 Section 902 Recycling Grant.

Leaf Waste consist of:

- *Leaves*
- *Shrubbery*
- *Garden residue*
- *Tree trimmings*
- *Similar materials*
- *NO grass clippings, stumps, or root balls*

Leaf Waste is a designated recyclable in Carroll Township.

Electronic Recycling

Under PA Act 108 (the state's Covered Device Recycling Act), it is unlawful for Pennsylvania landfills and resource recovery facilities to accept specific electronic devices (computers, computer peripherals and televisions) for disposal. PA waste haulers are also prohibited from collecting these electronics for disposal. Fairview Township's Electronic Recycling Center is open to all York County residents free of charge. Summer/Fall (April-Oct.) hours are Monday—Saturday, 8:00am to 4:30pm except holidays. Winter/Spring (Nov.-March) hours are Monday—Friday, 9:00am to Noon and the 1st and 3rd Saturday of every month, from 9:00am to Noon except holidays. Fairview Township's Electronics Drop Off Center is located at 55 Fairview Road, New Cumberland. Other electronic devices that are accepted at the drop-off include answering machines, CD players, fax machines, computer hard drives, mobile phones, modems, microwave ovens, pagers, small home office copiers, printers, printed circuit boards, clocks, radios, remote controls, stereos, tape players, MP3 players, electronic toys and games, photo and video cameras, telephones and telephone equipment, VCRs, toaster ovens, hair dryers, electric razors, and many other mixed household electronics. York County businesses, schools and organizations are not eligible to participate in this residential electronics recycling program. Unpaid personal taxes will be filed with the delinquent tax collector with added cost after December 31. Unpaid Real Estate Taxes will be liened with the York County Tax Claim Bureau after December 31.

MedReturn Drug Collection Unit

Carroll Township has a MedReturn medication take-back box in the lobby.

Accepted items include: prescriptions, prescription solid or liquid medications, prescription patches & ointments, inhalers, over-the-counter medication, vitamins, samples, medications for pets.

Not Accepted items include: thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, personal care products in the form of non-prescription ointments, liquids or lotions, medications from businesses or clinics, needles (sharps), bloody or infectious waste and hazardous waste.

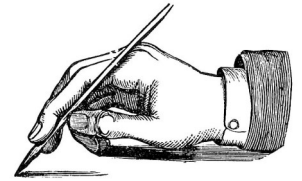
The lobby is open 8:30am to 4:30pm. Just look for the green MedReturn Box.

Medications collected in the take-back box program are delivered by law enforcement to the York County Solid Waste Authority's waste-to-energy facility for safe and complete destruction.

Seventeen York County police departments currently partner with the York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA) to host medication take-back boxes in their police department lobbies. In 2017, the program safely collected and disposed of a total of 5.51 tons of unused and expired medications, an increase of 1.31 tons over the 4.2 tons collected in 2016.



Annexation Petition Signatures Needed



Carroll Township and Dillsburg Borough are asking for your help to get the requisite number of signatures to get this question on the November ballot.

Carroll Township and Dillsburg Borough need your help to affect a change in the jurisdiction and boundary map to benefit both municipal governments. Recently Dillsburg Borough received a donation of land on the south side of Dillsburg Borough where the new playground and dog park has been built. Approximately 4.871 acres of the donated land extends into and is situated under Carroll Township’s jurisdiction. It is believed by the respective governing bodies that these 4.871 acres be annexed and governed by Dillsburg Borough, so they may use the land as they see fit without oversight by Carroll Township that no longer receives tax revenue from this parcel of land.

In order to change a jurisdiction’s boundary, it must go to the people of each municipality to vote on it via a referendum during an even year primary or a presidential or gubernatorial general election. In order to place a referendum on the ballot, a petition must be signed by registered voters in their respective jurisdictions. (The number of signatures is determined by a percentage, set by statute, of persons who voted in the previous general election for governor). Therefore, Dillsburg Borough had to get 40 signatures (actually over 50), which they did, and Carroll Township requires 110 (we need more than this (130) in case signatures are rejected). Currently there are 54 more signatures needed by Carroll Township before submitting the petitions to the York County Bureau of Elections. We are asking for your help to get the requisite number of signatures to get this question put on the November ballot.

Signing the petition does not mean you are for or against the referendum, all it does is place the referendum question on the November ballot, so that all the electors can vote, as they see fit. In order for the annexation to become effective, the referendum question must win by majority in both jurisdictions.

The referendum question being proposed is as follows:

“Shall the Borough of Dillsburg annex from the Township of Carroll approximately 4.871 acres of land adjacent to the Borough’s existing tract of land where the playground and dog park are located, on the end of South Chestnut Street and beginning of Old York Road (SR 4026), just south of Dillsburg Elementary school. The subject land is currently owned by Dillsburg Borough but located in Carroll Township (Parcel B on the Final Plat of a Minor Subdivision Plan recorded in the York County Recorder of Deeds in Book 2370 Page 3803, and Deed dated December 15, 2015, Recorded in Deed Book 2376 Page 3097). The purpose of the annexation of the land is to expand the playground and to construct a community building under the jurisdiction of the Dillsburg Borough?”

If you are a Carroll Township registered voter and would sign the petition, please come by the law office of Stone, Wiley & Linsenbach, PC at 3 N. Baltimore Street, Dillsburg, or the Carroll Township Building at 555 Chestnut Grove Road, Dillsburg, to sign the petition. **Signatures needed by August 3rd.**

Carroll Township and Dillsburg Borough voted to support the passage of this referendum.

Do I Need A Permit?

A **building permit** is needed for new construction, additions, alterations, renovations and repairs. Finishing basements, pre-built sheds, in ground and above ground swimming pools-inflatable pools included, and retaining walls also need a building permit. Most building permits fall under the PA Uniform Construction Code which require review of the application and inspections of the construction. In order to make it easier for our residents we handle the applications in house and use Approved Code Services and ARRO Consulting as our Municipal Code Officials. The cost of a building permit varies with each application. View our annual fee schedule online at www.carrolltownship.com.

A **zoning permit** is required when erecting or adding to any structure. New construction, additions, garages, sheds, swimming pools, concrete pads or pavers and fences are examples when a zoning permit is needed. A zoning permit is also needed for any in home business, any change of use, and to erect a sign. The cost of a zoning permit is \$50.00.



Most building projects will require both a building and zoning permit.

An **occupancy permit** is required for any new or renovated living space and is paid for when the building permit is applied for. The cost of the occupancy permit is \$25.00. When your construction is complete and you have your final inspection, please call the Township office to schedule your occupancy inspection.

A **driveway permit** is needed if constructing a new driveway, paving or altering an existing driveway. The cost of the driveway permit is \$25.00.

A **stormwater permit** is required with new construction that involves over 200 square feet of impervious area that does not have an approved plan to address on lot stormwater. Storm pipe installation and earth disturbance greater than 2000 SF require a stormwater permit. New homes, additions, pole buildings, or garages, and changes to driveways or landscape that create a possible runoff problem for their neighbor will require a stormwater permit. This permit is reviewed and issued by the Township. The cost of a stormwater permit depends on the area that is involved.

An **encroachment permit** is needed for an open cut or boring of a Township road or right-of-way. Cost of an encroachment permit is based on the square footage of the open cut. Boring is a flat fee. Bonding is required.

811 Know What's Below - Call Before You Dig









The PA One Call system is a communications system established to prevent damage to underground facilities and promote safety. It provides one telephone number for contractors and the general public to call for notification of their intent to use equipment for excavation, tunneling, grading, boring, blasting, demolition or any similar work.

There are many utilities that are now found underground, such as sewer, water, gas, electric, and telecommunications and we strive to not only prevent damage to these utilities but also to stress the importance of keeping our community safe by following proper digging techniques around underground facilities.

Are you planning to install a fence, plant or remove trees, or do any type of digging in your yard with power equipment? If so you are required to place a call to 811, PA's One Call at least three days in advance, so they can issue a ticket to all your local utility companies to mark their underground facilities. Calling PA One Call, by dialing 811, is for professional excavators and do-it yourself homeowners. If a homeowner is doing the actual work then it is the responsibility of the homeowner to contact PA One Call. However, if a homeowner has hired a contractor to do the work then the contractor is required to contact PA One Call.

It also is important to respect the marks indicating the presence of underground utilities. Excavation should be carefully performed only after confirming that all utilities have marked the location of their facilities. Remember that the locating of underground utility lines or facilities is not an exact science and location marks have varying degrees of required accuracy. These can range from 18 to 24 inches from the actual line or facility. For more information visit <http://www.pa1call.org>.

-  Blue - Potable Water

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Regulations and Best Practices

Stormwater pollution is a major topic in Pennsylvania and our region. Have you considered that this topics can also be applied to the simple task of washing your vehicle? Carroll Township, as a MS-4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System) municipality, would like to help outline the best and most environmentally friendly way to keep your vehicle shining like new.

Today, the “greenest” way to wash your car is to take it to an automatic car wash.

Studies show that an automatic car wash uses roughly half the water the average person would use while washing with a traditional bucket and hose. Our regulations require commercial carwash systems to contain and collect the dirty water used during a wash cycle. The waste water is discharged to the wastewater treatment plant where it is treated to remove materials harmful to our streams.

It can be argued that the most effective way to shine up your vehicle remains to be hand washing but it can be far from environmentally friendly. The main reasons for this are the excessive use of water and the release of harmful substances such as soap residue, oil, acid and metal particles into the storm sewer system while washing and rinsing. If you do plan to wash at home, your first step is to get automotive soap and cleaners that are biodegradable and non-toxic. Secondly, avoid washing on the pavement, which will let the wash water directly into a storm sewer.

Our storm sewers drain directly to streams that feed rivers like the Yellow Breeches and Bermudian Creeks. The wash water will carry pollutants with them to these waters. Washing over grass or gravel that will absorb the water into the ground to reduce or eliminate the environmental impact is best.



The following practices can help Carroll Township comply with MS4 regulations:

Reduce fertilizer use or use more natural or organic fertilizers.

Dispose of pet waste properly and do not deposit into storm sewer drains.

Maintain your septic system by having the septic tank inspected and pumped as necessary. (usually every 3 to 5 years).

Collect oil and other vehicle fluids with drip pan, and recycle or dispose of properly.

Store hazardous substances like solvents and cleaners properly to avoid leaks and spills.

Wash your vehicle on a grass surface and reduce the amount of soap used.

Plant trees, shrubs and rain gardens, and keep grass taller to control stormwater runoff.

Report soil and other pollutants leaving poorly managed construction sites.

Weed & Vegetation Ordinance

2003-150

Vegetation growing to a height exceeding twelve (12) inches on any lot or tract of ground in Carroll Township is declared to be a nuisance detrimental to the health, safety, welfare and comfort of the residents of Carroll Township.

The word vegetation shall mean, but not be limited to grass, weeds, vines and similar growths, jimson, burdock, ragweed, thistle, cocklebur, chicory and those weeds defined and appearing on the noxious weed control list as defined under the Noxious Weed Control Law.

Vegetation may be considered a nuisance if it throws off any unpleasant or noxious odors, conceals any filthy deposit, produces pollen or is not planted for some useful, ornamental or agricultural purpose.

All vegetation as defined herein, on any premises growing to a height exceeding twelve (12) inches shall be cut by the person, owner, lessee or other individual having a present interest in the said real estate. Failure to comply herewith shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance.



Nuisance Ordinance

2003-149

The following are declared to be nuisances when it is established that such activities or conditions are contrary to the health and welfare of the people of Carroll Township.

- A. Accumulations of garbage, rubbish and/or trash on private or public property.
- B. Storage of abandoned or junked vehicle(s) on private or public property.
- C. The carrying-on of any offensive manufacture or business.
- D. Maintaining or permitting the existence of any vegetation matter on or near any public thoroughfare which hinders or obscures the view of motorists of any road, thoroughfare, traffic device or sign.
- E. Maintaining or permitting the existence of any dangerous structure on public or private grounds.
- F. Any other activity or condition conducted or existing on public or private property which in law and in fact constitutes a public nuisance.

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Carroll Township has a Complaint Form (available on www.carrolltownship.com) which must be filled out and submitted to the office so the Code Enforcement Officer can investigate the alleged nuisance and if a nuisance exists, to notify the person allegedly in violation.

Copies of the above Ordinances are available at the Township Office.

Lifetime Dog Licenses are issued by the York County Treasurer's Office. This requires your dog to be micro-chipped. A lifetime permanent license tag is issued which eliminates the need to purchase annual dog licenses. If you have questions regarding dog licenses, please call **717-771-4386** for more information.
