Carroll Township Public Works Department takes pride in keeping roads in good condition and safe for travel. Maintaining and keeping roads hazard free is a constant task. Township road project for the summer of 2026 will include the following:

- **Logan Road** – culvert replacement, road base repair and resurfacing. Resurfacing will consist of the placement of hot mix Superpave asphalt over the entire width of the roadway.

This paving project will be tentatively taking place between June and September. Dates of the proposed construction will be posted on the Township website, and on site prior to work beginning. Expect road closures or lane restrictions for this work.

The Township Road Crew will be out and about working on various projects and maintenance of infrastructure throughout the Township. This includes roadside mowing, tree trimming, crack sealing, pothole repair, park maintenance, catch basin / culvert repair & cleaning and more. As always, please be on the lookout for the crew and use patience and caution when traveling through work areas.

## Retired Flag Disposal Box:



Do you have a worn flag to dispose of? Carroll Township has a retired flag drop-off box located just inside the main doors. Collected flags will be given to the American Legion for proper disposal. Flags may be dropped off during normal office hours.

## Safe Medication Disposal Box:

Carroll Township has a Safe Medication Disposal box in the lobby. In 2025 500 pounds were collected.

**Accepted** items include: prescriptions, prescription solid or liquid medications, prescription patches & ointments, inhalers, over-the-counter medication, vitamins, and medications for pets.

**Not Accepted** items include: thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, personal care products in the form of non-prescription ointments, liquids or lotions, medications from businesses or clinics, needles (sharps), bloody or infectious waste and hazardous waste.

Medications collected in the take-back box program are delivered by law enforcement to the York County Solid Waste Authority's waste-to-energy facility for safe and complete destruction. Law enforcement also maintains the box and secures medications that are received until they can be destroyed.

Eighteen York County police departments currently partner with the York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA) to host Secure Medication Disposal boxes in their police department lobbies.

## Carroll Township Police Department:

Reminder: The Police Department reminds residents not to leave voice messages for officers at the office for calls for service. Residents are asked to contact the non-emergency number for York County 911 at 717-854-5571. The 911 center will then dispatch an officer to either call you or respond in person based on the call type.



The role of the Northern York County Unified Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) is to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters. The mission is to help preserve lives and property in disasters. Our unified group representing Dillsburg, Carroll Twp., Franklintown, Monaghan Twp., Warrington Twp., and Wellsville is made up of volunteers from those municipalities. Per PA State

Law, every municipality must have a preparedness plan in place.

For this newsletter, we are focusing on **preparing for power outages**. These are not uncommon and can result from wind, ice, snow, or even a squirrel or rodent getting where they are not supposed to be. In the event of a power outage, you don't want to suddenly have to scramble for supplies. So, while you have power, it's a good idea to assemble everything you need in one place.

We live in a world where we can easily connect through cellular services and the internet. Please make sure that you keep your cell phone and other devices charged. In addition, make sure you have all the required adapters to use your automobile as a phone charger. On your phone, please ensure that your critical contacts are listed.

During a power outage, the company that supplies power to your residence will play a key role in restoring your service. As part of emergency preparedness, we recommend reviewing their webpage to learn how to report an outage in advance. To do this, you must log in to your account through the device you will use when the power is out. Please take the time now to familiarize yourself with the pull-down menus regarding outages. This is where you can report an outage and receive critical updates on power restoration. If you would rather report by phone, please have your power company listed in your contacts. The phone number to report outages for Met Ed is 888-544-4877, and for Adams Electric, it is 800-726-2324. Please check your electric bills to ensure you are contacting the correct provider. **Calling in an outage will require providing your address, phone number, and account number.**

In addition, keep a flashlight and spare batteries on hand. If you have essential medical equipment, please consider purchasing a battery backup. Set aside extra blankets, a first-aid kit, and medications as you prepare. You must also have a supply of bottled water and convenience foods that do not require cooking. Remember the can opener!

### **A summary of preparing for power outages:**

- **Keep cell phones and other devices charged and have adaptors for charging in your vehicle.**
- **Keep critical contact details in your cell phone to provide or request assistance.**
- **Become familiar with the power providers' website or report an outage by calling Met Ed at 888-544-4877 or Adams Electric at 800-726-2324.**
- **Keep critical supplies on hand.**

## Why Grass Clippings Don't Belong in Our Streams:

It's a common sight after mowing—grass clippings left on sidewalks, streets, or even blown or placed directly into a nearby storm drain or stream. While it may seem like a harmless way to “get rid of” yard waste, this practice can have serious consequences for local waterways and downstream ecosystems like the Chesapeake Bay.



### *What Happens When Grass Clippings Enter Water?*

Grass clippings are not just plant debris, they are packed with nutrients, particularly nitrogen and phosphorus. When they wash into streams, ponds, or storm drains, they begin to break down quickly. This decomposition process sets off a chain reaction that can degrade water quality. First, the release of nutrients fuels rapid algae growth, a process known as eutrophication. While some algae are natural and beneficial, excessive growth can cloud the water, block sunlight needed by underwater plants, and in some cases produce harmful toxins that affect people, pets, and wildlife. At the same time, as microbes decompose the clippings, they consume oxygen in the water. This process is measured as biochemical oxygen demand. When oxygen levels drop too low, fish, crabs, and other aquatic organisms cannot survive. In severe cases, this can lead to fish kills and the loss of important habitat. Reducing even small sources of nutrient pollution—like grass clippings—plays an important role in protecting streams, improving water clarity, and supporting healthy aquatic life. *Better Options for Your Yard*

The good news is that there are easy, environmentally friendly alternatives:

- **Grasscycle:** Leave clippings on your lawn. They break down quickly and return nutrients to the soil, reducing the need for fertilizer.
- **Compost:** Collect clippings and add them to a compost pile to create a valuable soil amendment.
- **Keep it off hard surfaces:** Sweep or blow clippings back onto the lawn instead of into streets, sidewalks, or storm drains.

### *A Simple Action with Real Benefits*

Keeping grass clippings out of streams is a small step that can have a meaningful impact. By changing how we manage yard waste, we help reduce nutrient pollution, protect aquatic habitats, and support the health of our local waterways.

Clean water starts in our own backyards—and every effort counts.

Payments may be made by mail or in person. If a receipt is required, you must include both copies of the tax bill and a stamped self-addressed envelope. There is a drop box at the township where you can drop payments. If paying in person, please note the receptionist cannot mark your bills paid. You will have to leave them and include a paid postage envelope for receipts to be mailed back. Checks accepted subject to clearance.

## Overhead wires:

Keep in mind that the Carroll Township Road Crew **is not permitted** to remove any limbs or trees that have come in contact with overhead utility wires of any kind. To report trees or limbs on wires, the appropriate utility shall be contacted. If the wires have been torn down and are on the street or posing a hazard for vehicular traffic, please contact the appropriate utility or contact 911.



## Ore Bank Road Reconstruction:

The reconstruction of Ore Bank Road between US Route 15 and West Siddonsburg Road is underway. This work is anticipated to be completed in August of 2026. The project intends to soften the horizontal curve, widen the roadway, install turning lanes as well as curbing and drainage facilities. The road will be closed for most of this work and a detour will be posted and utilized. This project will create a safer travel condition on Ore Bank Road and will ultimately integrate with the roundabout that is currently in the design phase. Please abide by the posted detour route. We anticipate your patience and cooperation with the road closure.

## Logan Park Happenings:

Logan Park is looking forward to an exciting and busy season as we appreciate the warmer weather and sunny days. The park is a busy place with local sports organizations returning to our fields. A special thank you to our local boy scout troop that recently helped with picking sticks and branches that fell over the winter. One of the plans for spring clean-up is to plant two new basswood trees which were funded by an anonymous donor.



Because of the number of motor scooters and e-bikes that are using the pathway at Logan Park, 5 mph signs were installed. Many of these e-bikes and scooters are considered “motorized vehicles” and there have been concerns expressed regarding the speed and manner the vehicles are operating along the path. Please consider the safety of all who use the path. The park would also like to remind everyone that dogs must be leashed at all times while at the park. Fines may be imposed. Keep in mind these rules pertain to all Township Parks. Anyone who is interested in
